GO: The Conspiracy of Love Requires NEW Expectations ...

Luke 7:18-35

i. We need to have our expectations AMPP'd

I. AMBIGUITY (18-20)

- A. Uncertainty and doubt are not new to anyone seeking.
- B. The psychological adversity of doubt carries the seed of real growth.
- C. Jesus didn't match John's expectations.

II. MARGINALIZED (21-23)

- A. The issue is not one of belief in Jesus as Messiah. The issue is around whether these are the things that a Messiah does.
- B. There was curing, the blind receive sight, the lame walk, lepers are cured, the deaf hear, dead are raised, and the poor are seen as real people.
- C. No one is a throw away.
- D. The uniqueness of Jesus' ministry should not trip anyone up.

III. PROPHETIC (24-29)

- A. Not the same old same old, not a big Hollywood celebrity, not echoing public opinion or spokesman for the wealthy.
- B. The prophet from Malachi 3:1. The AP just listed John as the number one prophet on the Top Ten Prophet list.

IV. PERSECUTION (30-35)

- A. Disturbingly divisive.
 - B. Many don't like what they see like children who "take their marbles and go home" when they don't get their way.
 - C. Many don't really want to discover how God is at work as much as they want to control how God does things. OUCH!
